Modern local government boundary change	In 1871 Holme Island was included in the Parish. When Grange CP was created in 1894 the area of the Parish was reduced. Within Lake District National Park boundary from 1951.

Extent of common moor or fell	Estimate area 8000 acres (3237 ha)Commons, waste grounds, mosses – in townships of Staveley, Lower Allithwaite, Broughton, Upper Allithwaite, Lower Holker, Cartmel Fell, Upper Holker
Date of enclosure	Cartmel Enclosure Act 1796. Date of Award 1809
Population	567 in 1811, rising to 771 in 1821 then fluctuating throughout the 19 th century. 763 in 1901 including Lindale and Newton falling to 675 in 1951 but rising again by 2001 to 824.
Landownership [<i>summary manorial descent (if known); other major estates (if known)</i>] (Please limit to 5 lines maximum)	John le Fleming granted lands in Newton and Allithwaite to Richard de Copeland. Given to Cartmel Priory in 1245, remaining in that manor. Lindale granted to the Knights of St. John of Jerusalem in 1292, Purchased from the Crown in 1636 by Robert Rawlinson, descended with Cark Hall until 1860.
Economic Activity [<i>excluding agriculture; i.e. mines, quarries,</i>	1847 Lindale corn mill, PO, quarries, limekilns, inns.

<i>manufacturing, markets etc]</i> (Please limit to 5 lines maximum)	1912 several inns located in Lindale and Newton because both were on the turnpike route to Furness; timber merchant and seed mill at Lindale with shoemaker, butcher, stonemason and apartments but becoming a quiet resort. Four car showrooms from late 20 th century. Castlehead Field Study Centre established in late 20 th century.
Places of Worship <i>[date of foundation and denomination]</i> (please limit to 5 lines maximum)	Chapel in Lindale noted in 1577 but date of establishment unknown; St Paul's Church (C of E) built in 1828 and a chapel was opened in 1875. In 1677 Friends Meeting House established at Height to the NW of Lindale.
Schools and Other Institutions (Please limit to 5 lines maximum)	Lindale Church school built 1838, enlarged 1894; and an Apostolic school established by the Fathers of the Holy Ghost existed at Castle Head during the 20th century. Newton school built 1875 Newton Institute and mission room Lindale Working Men's Institute
